Today's Readings

Malachi 3:1-4

Thus says the Lord, See, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me, and the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple. The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight-- indeed, he is coming, says the Lord of hosts. But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears? For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap; he will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the descendants of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, until they present offerings to the Lord in righteousness. Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the Lord as in the days of old and as in former years.

Since God's children share flesh and blood, Jesus himself likewise shared the same things, so that through death he might destroy the one who has the power of death, that is, the devil, and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by the fear of death. For it is clear that he did not come to help angels, but the descendants of Abraham. Therefore he had to become like his brothers and sisters in every respect, so that he might be a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make a sacrifice of atonement for the sins of the people. Because he himself was tested by what he suffered, he is able to help those who are being tested.

When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, the parents of Jesus brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord (as it is written in the law of the Lord, "Every firstborn male shall be designated as holy to the Lord"), and they offered a sacrifice according to what is stated in the law of the Lord, "a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons." Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; this man was righteous and devout, looking forward to the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit rested on him. The Boy Scouts of America

"Today is Scout Sunday, which is a day that recognizes the contributions of both young people and adults involved in Scouting. In the first part of the Scout Oath, the member declares, "On my honor I will do my best to do my duty to God and my country and to obey the Scout Law." The recognition of God as the primary spiritual force in the world and the grateful acknowledgment of all the favors and blessings received, are recognized as necessities to growing up strong, just as a sunflower needs the sun. Scouting America, however, is nonsectarian and recognizes many different religious devotions.

There are many adult leaders who have stepped up to the plate in guiding and nourishing our youth in their journeys. It is perhaps not fair to only mention four, since many more have all been essential to the character formation and growth of these young people. However, today we'd like to especially recognize Charles "Chuck" and Heather Rose, and Courtney and John Atkinson. Chuck and Heather started Pack 42 here on 09/01/2014 with their boys and kept the Scouting mission at the church active through a decade. Chuck was recognized on 11/01/2015 with the Adult Award for Emergency Preparedness, on 05/18/2017 with the William D. Boyce Organizer Award, and on 02/04/2022 with the Scoutmaster's Key. He handed over Pack 42 to Courtney Atkinson on 11/21/2020, who was Cubmaster through 6/9/2024. Courtney oversaw the Pack during a tremendous time of growth and upheaval: COVID, problems with Episcopal/Anglican relations, and a surge of population on Johns Island. Her husband John remains active as an assistant Cubmaster, Den Leader, and has been instrumental in encouraging adults to complete advanced training in Scouting such as Wood Badge, an advanced, national leadership course. He has helped raise the commitment level among the other adults in the program by doing so himself."

We have a Cub Scout Pack and a Boy Scout Troop that meet regularly at Walton Hall. Cubs meet twice a month and the Scouts meet at least once a month. Charles "Chuck" and Heather Rose started this program years ago and carried it through all the travails of COVID and the church difficulties. My son, Bennett, after joining the Pack 9/13/2022, volunteered me to become Committee Chair for the Pack on 12/13/2022. The Cub Scout Pack has been blossoming, benefitting from the influx of growth on Johns Island. Starting from a handful of children in 2022, we now have 28 active members, both boys and girls. You read that right, we have girls in Scouts! One of our adult leaders is also active in recruiting members from the Latinx community. We also now have nine adult leaders in the Pack who have all completed background checks and youth protection training, ensuring the safety of the children entrusted to our care. Heather Rose handed off the Chartered Organization Representative position to me on 11/28/2023 as she and Chuck move on to other endeavors in life. Scouting has a unique position among the many activities at the church in that it is chartered by St John's Episcopal Church, and all the finances of the Scouts are owned by the church. As part of our ongoing stewardship, we established an account with the church in April of 2024. We currently have \$2,142 in the account and use this to fund activities for the children (launching rockets, visiting the Hunley, going to Mace Brown museum) and supporting Scouts in membership fees.
